3. Tip Fees

Bill Ellison raised an issue relating to the potential abuse of tip access privileges when the Bungendore waste transfer station opened in May 2011 and started to charge gate fees. There was concern that users would bypass the Bungendore facility, with its associated gate fees, and use the Macs Reef Road landfill, where access was still free.

It was unanimously acknowledged that this was a potential problem, and a wide ranging discussion of potential solutions followed. The discussion included consideration of:

- current tip access arrangements;
- use of the landfill for dumping of out of area commercial waste;
- the practicality of restricting access to residents only;
- the materials that would be accepted if fees were introduced; and
- the timing of any introduction of fees.

The Working Group arrived at the following recommendations:

- (a) That fees be introduced at the Macs Reef Road landfill coincident with the opening of the Bungendore waste transfer station and that, from that time, the Macs Reef Road facility be managed as if it were a waste transfer station with respect to the fees that are levied and materials that are accepted;
- (b) That in the interim, from 1 July 2010, the Macs Reef Road facility be controlled so that only holders of a valid tip pass or voucher have access.

It was agreed that it would be appropriate to develop a community education program to help reinforce the change in waste management practices and that the content of such a program should be the subject of a future discussion.
