Margaret Houssenlodge's letter in the last "Whisper" prompts me to put pen to paper, firstly for support, and secondly to congratulate her for at least having a go. It is obvious to me that dogs could be a bigger problem than they are now, as our community expands. Land owners must realise that they are responsible for their dogs and what they do.

How anyone can criticize Margaret for speeding I don't know. A lot of people (or should I say ratbags) may recognize Margaret's little bronze Torana, probably as they have passed her. I know Margaret personally and a more responsible dog owner and person you would never meet.

Having said all that, I would like to take the opportunity to express my feelings in regard to the high speed drivers using the roads in our community. This is not suburbia and no one is asking the drivers using the community roads to drive at 60kph, but 120kph and in some cases 120kph+ is absolutely stupid. I have even been passed on corners.

There are kids on motorbikes and wandering stock. OK, they shouldn't be there, but they are, and could easily be under your car before you are aware of it. How would you feel if someone's child was killed and you were responsible? Or are you one of those good people who thinks "it won't happen to me"? It could happen to someone driving at say 80kph, but survival on impact would be much greater than at 120kph.

Norton Road itself is no monza track. I see the council in its wisdom is out fiddling with the potholes. It's a pity that no one has told them that you fill in potholes, not just reline them. These relined potholes in themselves are a traffic hazard to road users who travel at reasonable speeds, let alone to the high speed Jackie Stewarts. The road is chopped up fairly badly by heavy trucks using it and the hill just before Marino Vale Drive (and bus stop) is a disaster. I know of one responsible driver who blew a tyre there travelling at a slow speed. The result of the same thing happening to a driver at high speed can easily be imagined, but what if kids were disembarking from the school bus? That I don't even want to consider.

I have also noticed several times people just driving out of their drives without looking at all.

There have been several accidents on Norton Road already. Let's not turn it into a horror strip. Let's all try and slow down just a little. We live in a great community. Let's try and be safe as well, especially while commuting on our roads.

EARTHWORM CASTINGS

Each earthworm ingests its weight in organic matter every 24 hours. Its intricate digestive tract makes it possible for the tigerworm to excrete a highly nutritious fertilizer known as castings. These castings are the most perfect plant food known to man, and contain:

- 5 times the available nitrogen
- 7 times the available phosphorus
- 3 times the exchangeable magnesium
- 11 times the available potash
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ times more calcium than found in 6" good topsoil

These increases are directly attributable to the organic matter eaten by earthworms.

Earthworm casts contain more micro-organisms, inorganic minerals and organic matter in a form available to plants, than soil. Casts also contain enzymes which continue to disintegrate organic matter even after they have been excreted.

Castings can be applied to your lawn or garden in the same way that other manures are applied; by spreading on top of the ground and being watered in. The difference is that castings will not burn plant roots, since the raw nitrogen content is much lower than for may kinds of manure.

Castings are more porous than most soils, and will therefore require more water initially. However, the castings will also hold more water than conventional soils, and therefore may need watering less frequently. Further, since castings are a material extremely rich in humus — the final stage of organic matter decomposition, and since their mineral nutrients are in a slow release form, plants in castings will need less food or fertilizer, if any, than those in conventional soil or planting media.

Vermipost (castings) has several advantages over commerical potting mixes, which are often just a blend of wood wastes, urea, and possibly NPK fertilizer. Vermipost contain valuable micro-organisms that are of benefit to young plants, especially cuttings which strike very well in castings. Because of this factor and the very high level of available nutrients, plants grown in vermipost show superior root development, faster initial growth and therefore a more sturdy plant than those grown in another medium.




